Lunches

In order to flourish, we need a healthy body and mind.

School meals are carefully planned and nutritionally balance by professionals in the catering team. The menu is available on the school website.



Packed lunches from home are provided for many of our children and we would encourage you to consider how healthy they are? Guidance suggests that we should aim:

- For every lunch to have two pieces of fruit or vegetables, which includes at least one savoury item.
- Every lunch to contain a portion of protein.
- That no lunches contain sugary or fatty foods.
- For water to be the only drink.

For the safety of our children, lunches should contain:

Black shoes, white polo shirt, Sharow school or plain navy jumper/cardigan, navy or dark grey skirt, skort or trousers. Blue gingham dress or dark grey shorts in the summer.

Hair accessories should be in simple and smart. Not brightly coloured.

As we encourage our Reception children to spend their learning time exploring the environment, which very often includes mud, sand, paint and water, the children in reception can wear either a white or navy-blue polo shirt.

PE Kit: Blue shorts, plain white t-shirt, socks, pumps, trainers (for outdoor use). Navy tracksuit bottoms and Sharow school or <u>plain</u> navy jumper. Hair must be tied up and no jewellery to be worn for PE.

Nursery to Year 2 - School uniform should be worn every day. PE kits should be kept in school during the week and taken home on Fridays. Years 3-6 — School uniform should be worn on days when a PE lesson is not timetabled. PE kits can be worn for the whole day when the children have PE

What to bring to school?

Children should bring the following:

- a full water bottle (to be taken home each day, cleaned and filled)
- if required, packed lunch (ensuring all packaging can be opened by your child)
- Reading book and reading record
- Fruit or vegetable for a snack at break (KS1 receive fruit from school)
- Waterproof coat
- Sun hat/cap

If sun protection is necessary, please apply liberally before school. It is preferred that children do not bring large bags into school as storage is limited to their lockers.
