Learning in Mixed-Age Classes at Sharow CE Primary

We are proud of our mixed-age class structure, which offers unique benefits for both academic progress and personal development. Recently, a few parents have asked how this approach works in practice—so we'd love to share more!

In mixed-age classes, pupils from different year groups learn together in the same classroom. This is a well-established model in many small schools and is thoughtfully designed to meet the needs of all learners.

Why Mixed-Age Classes Work Well

- Tailored Learning: Teachers plan carefully to ensure that activities are matched to each child's stage of learning. Pupils are challenged appropriately, whether they need support or extension.
- Peer Support: Older pupils often take on mentoring roles, helping younger classmates and reinforcing their own understanding in the process.
- Flexible Grouping: Children work in a variety of groupings, which helps build collaboration, independence, and confidence.
- Continuity and Relationships: Pupils often stay with the same teacher for more than one year, allowing for strong relationships and deeper understanding of individual learning needs.

Curriculum Planning and Delivery

Our curriculum is carefully sequenced to ensure progression across year groups. Teachers use assessment and observation to adapt lessons so that all pupils can access the content and make progress. We revisit key knowledge regularly to help pupils retain and build on what they've learned.

Parental Consent for Use of Images and Content on Social Media

At Sharow CE Primary School, we love to celebrate our pupils' achievements and share the vibrant life of our school with the wider community. Occasionally, we may post photographs, short videos, or examples of pupils' work on our official school Facebook page, and sometimes share this content with local community Facebook groups to highlight events and

successes.

To ensure transparency and protect your child's privacy, please read the following information carefully before giving consent.

How We Use Images and Content

- Images and videos are used only to showcase school activities, events, and learning experiences.

- We never include full names of pupils alongside images.

- Content is posted only on the school's official Facebook page and may be shared with trusted local community groups to promote school events and achievements.

Safeguarding and AI Considerations

- Publicly available images, including those shared on social media, can potentially be accessed and used by third parties, including for training artificial intelligence (AI) systems. While this is not the intention of our school, it is a known risk associated with any content shared online.

- Once an image is posted publicly, the school cannot control how it may be used or reshared by others, even with privacy settings in place.

- For this reason, we take safeguarding seriously and limit the types of images shared, ensuring they are appropriate, respectful, and do not compromise pupil safety.

Withdrawing Consent

You may withdraw your consent at any time by contacting the school or accessing your Arbor app.

- If you withdraw consent, the school will no longer publish images of your child on social media.

- We will remove any existing images from our Facebook page upon request.

- However, we cannot retrieve or delete images that may have already been accessed or used by third parties, including those that Meta (Facebook's parent company) may have used to train its AI models.

- Once a post is shared with local community groups, the school is unable to retrieve or remove it from those external pages or platforms.

- The Sleep Charity also found that **70% of children** are going to bed later and **74% are using technology more** at night, both of which can negatively impact sleep quality **2**.
