#### What is the procedure for applying for leave during term time?

The application form for leave can be found in the attachments at the bottom of this page. In short, please provide school with as much notice and information as possible, ideally at least 6 weeks prior to the requested date of leave. Confirmation will be provided by the school confirming whether the request is authorised or not. We advise that parents and carers do not book any travel until they receive confirmation from school. We couldn't be prouder of Isla, who at a difficult time she has focused her energy on giving back.
