

What is the procedure for applying for leave during term time?

The application form can be found below. In short, please provide school with as much notice and information as possible, ideally at least 6 weeks prior to the requested date of leave. Confirmation will be provided by the school confirming whether the request is authorised or not. We advise that parents and carers do not book any travel until they receive confirmation from school. PE with Mr Crooks

This term has been another success in PE and the children continue to make super progress in a range of topics. Mr Crooks has been working very closely with Reception/ Nursey, Year 1/2, Year 3/4, and Year 5/6.

Before half term, Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 began working on different skills used in Football.

We explored different ways of dribbling, passing, and shooting. Year 3/4 practiced passing and moving with control, where Year 5/6 focused on how to defend individually and as a team in small-sided games.

Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 demonstrated fantastic tactical awareness in small games and matches, as well as brilliant social skills.

More recently, the classes in KS1 have been exploring different Invasion and team activities. The standard of skills on show and the weekly progress being made was incredible. The children should be complimented on their efforts and skills progression.

Highlights include EYFS making terrific progress when evading opponents and moving with control and Year 1/2 showing great control and accuracy when passing.




- Bake a Christmas cake together.

JOURNEY TO BETHLEHEM


Tuesday 24th December, 11:00am


