Both classes have been working on a number of different skills used in invasion games. We explored various skills that are required, such as evading defenders, intercepting, and passing as a team.

Simmonds Class practiced passing a ball with control, I was particularly impressed with their spatial awareness and how they developed their knowledge of the rules of the games they played.

Adams Class focused on how to attack individually and as a team in small-sided games. The children worked really well in teams, and it was great to see them apply the skills developed within their small, sided games.

Both classes demonstrated fantastic tactical awareness in small games and matches, as well as brilliant social skills.

The children should be of their efforts and skills progression. A big well done for the children that attended the multi sports afterschool club. # Reminder: Daily Cleaning and Drying of Children's Water Bottles

As part of our commitment to maintaining a healthy and hygienic environment for our children, we would like to remind parents and guardians about the importance of daily cleaning and drying of children's water bottles.

Why is this important?

- Health and Hygiene: Regular cleaning prevents the buildup of bacteria and mould, ensuring that your child has access to clean drinking water throughout the day.
- Safety: Properly dried bottles reduce the risk of contamination and keep your child's water bottle safe to use.

#### Tips for Cleaning:

- 1. Daily Rinse: Rinse the bottle with warm water and mild soap every day.
- 2. Deep Clean: Once a week, use a bottle brush to scrub all parts of the bottle, including the lid and straw.
- 3. Dry Thoroughly: After washing, allow the bottle to air dry completely before reassembling.


