Saltburn

Tuesday brought most of the school to the beautiful seaside town of Saltburn, not just for a day of fresh air and fun—but for a day of learning in the great outdoors!

Our EYFS children explored the seaside through the lens of discovery. They learned about different types of transport, looked at maps, and talked about what they could see at the seaside—from waves and sand to boats and birds.

Year 1/2 focused on geography, identifying human and natural features around Saltburn. With clipboards in hand, they conducted a tally survey, counting how many shops, benches, and cafés they could spot along the promenade.

Meanwhile, Year 5/6 took on an environmental mission. They collected data on how much rubbish they could find along the beach and promenade, linking their findings to their current topic: "Why are oceans important and how can we protect them?" Their observations sparked thoughtful conversations about pollution, conservation, and the role we all play in caring for our planet.

And of course, no trip to the seaside would be complete without a splash—we also managed a paddle in the sea, which brought squeals of delight and sandy toes all around! It was a day full of sunshine, sea breeze, and meaningful learning, with each year group gaining new insights from their surroundings. A perfect blend of education and exploration!



Sacred Art Day at the Cathedral

Year 3/4 had a truly inspiring day at Ripon Cathedral, taking part in the Sacred Art Day. Surrounded by the beauty and history of the cathedral, the children explored their creativity through a variety of artistic activities.

They began by listening to the powerful Bible stories of Jonah and the Whale and Jesus Calms the Storm (Mark 4:35–41), reflecting on the themes of trust, courage, and faith. These stories sparked thoughtful discussions and inspired the artwork that followed.

The children created individual collage pieces, using a range of textures and colours to express their interpretations of the stories. Working together, they also designed and constructed a large collaborative group artwork, which beautifully captured the spirit of the day and the messages they had explored.

It was a day full of creativity, reflection, and teamwork—one that the children will remember for a long time.

Learning in Mixed-Age Classes at Sharow CE Primary

We are proud of our mixed-age class structure, which offers unique benefits for both academic progress and personal development. Recently, a few parents have asked how this approach works in practice—so we'd love to share more!

In mixed-age classes, pupils from different year groups learn together in the same classroom. This is a well-established model in many small schools and is thoughtfully designed to meet the needs of all learners.

- Why Mixed-Age Classes Work Well
 - Tailored Learning: Teachers plan carefully to ensure that activities are matched to each child's stage of learning. Pupils are challenged appropriately, whether they need support or extension.
 - Peer Support: Older pupils often take on mentoring roles, helping younger classmates and reinforcing their own understanding in the process.
 - Flexible Grouping: Children work in a variety of groupings, which helps build collaboration, independence, and confidence.
 - Continuity and Relationships: Pupils often stay with the same teacher for more than one year, allowing for strong relationships and deeper understanding of individual learning needs.

Q Curriculum Planning and Delivery

Our curriculum is carefully sequenced to ensure progression across year groups. Teachers use assessment and observation to adapt lessons so that all pupils can access the content and make progress. We revisit key knowledge regularly to help pupils retain and build on what they've learned.
