The essential staff training, which was originally scheduled for January 4th, but was cancelled by the trainer due to the snow, has now been rescheduled. The new training dates are **June 4th and July 9th** and will take place after school.

Please note that there will be no after school club on these dates as all staff are required to attend. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in making alternative arrangements with this advance notice.

#### **Future status of the school**

The governing body is required to regularly review the status of the school. This includes reviewing the possibility of joining an academy trust.

Following investigation by a working group of governors, the board has taken the decision to start the process of joining Yorkshire Causeway Schools Trust (YCST). Leeds Diocese have granted conditional approval, and we are now at the start of that formal process.

It is very important to note that this is not finalised in any way.

Over the coming months, YCST will be conducting due diligence on the school. Essentially, while the board believes that joining YCST would benefit the children's education, YCST have to be reassured that it would be beneficial to the Trust.

In addition, we are required to run a formal consultation with yourselves as parents of students at the school. Joining the Trust cannot happen without taking into account your thoughts, and answering any questions you may have.

We are currently working on the timeline of work required and we will keep you informed as things progress.

## **Supervision of Siblings on School Grounds**

To ensure a safe and secure environment for all pupils, we ask that siblings remain under close parental supervision at all times while on school grounds.

#### In the event of a lockdown:

- 1. **Email Communication**: We will use email as our primary method of communication to keep you informed about the situation. Please ensure that your contact information is up to date in our records.
- 2. **Telephone Lines**: Our telephone lines will be reserved for communication with emergency services. We kindly request that you refrain from calling the school during a lockdown to keep these lines open for urgent communication.
- 3. **Do Not Come to the School**: For your safety and to avoid obstructing emergency services, please do not come to the school during a lockdown. We will provide instructions on when it is safe to pick up your child.
- 4. **Reunification Plan**: After the lockdown is lifted, we will follow our reunification plan to ensure that children are safely reunited with their families. Details of the reunification process will be communicated via email.

**Washing Pods and Capsules - Child Accident Prevention Trust** 

Young children are vulnerable to all sorts of dangers in the home. One of the most present issues can come in the form of every day cleaning products. Some like sink unclogger can look like fruit juice. The thick consistency and similarity to apple juice in colour make it particularly enticing. However, one threat stands out from all others in this regard. The washing pod. Many washing pods bear a striking similarity to over the counter confectionary. For children the mistake can be easy to make, especially when washing pods may be kept in a lower location than other cleaning supplies. ## **Testing Children's Eyesight in School**

As a forward-thinking school, we are committed to supporting the health and wellbeing of our current pupils and future generations. We are pleased to share the results of a school-led vision-checking project conducted in collaboration with other schools in the north of England.

**Project Overview** 

Our project aimed to determine if specially trained school staff could accurately check the eyesight of children, helping to detect vision problems that might impact their education. A total of 12 primary and secondary schools participated, with 851 children completing both the school-led and follow-up vision checks conducted by optometrists.

Key Findings

By comparing the results of the vision checks conducted by teachers with those by optometrists, the accuracy of the assessments were found. Here are the key findings:

- Normal Vision: 707 children were found to have vision at a normal level for their age.
- Recommendations: 144 children received a letter recommending an eye test at a local optician.
- Accuracy: The school-led vision checks had an accuracy rate of approximately 80% compared to the optometrists' checks.

Impact and Future Steps

This project highlights the potential for schools to play a crucial role in early detection of vision problems, ensuring timely intervention and support for affected children. We are

proud of our staff's dedication and the positive impact this initiative has had on our pupils' health and education.

We look forward to continuing our efforts in promoting the health and wellbeing of our children, both now and in the future.
