# 🍀 Celebrating Positive Noticing Day at Sharow 🍀

On Wednesday 12th November, Sharow School will be joining hundreds of schools across the UK in celebrating Positive Noticing Day—a powerful initiative designed to uplift, encourage, and build stronger relationships through the simple act of noticing and acknowledging positive behaviour.

What is Positive Noticing Day?

Started by behaviour expert Paul Dix, Positive Noticing Day is all about catching children (and adults!) doing the right thing and marking it with a meaningful, positive acknowledgement. It's not just about being nice—it's about being deliberate, reflective, and kind. The impact is immediate and long-lasting, helping to build self-esteem, confidence, and a culture of kindness.

How We're Taking Part

Everyone will receive a positive label—a small tag with a handwritten message celebrating something wonderful about them. These labels can be tied to bags, clothing or kept privately. Pupils will also be encouraged to positively notice their peers, sharing kind observations that highlight strengths, efforts, and character.

#### Get Involved at Home

Families can take part by creating their own "pride patch" at home—sharing positive labels with each other and displaying them on the fridge, in a frame, or wherever they'll be seen and remembered.

## Significantly Damaged or Not Returned Book Policy

At Sharow School, our vision is to flourish together, and our rules remind us to be ready and respectful in everything we do. This includes how we care for our reading books.

Reading books are an important part of your child's learning journey, and we make a substantial investment to ensure every child has access to high-quality texts both at home and in school. To keep this programme sustainable, we have a policy for books that are lost, not returned, or damaged.

Charge for lost or damaged books: £5 per book

This is not intended as a punishment but to replace books so all children can continue to enjoy reading.
