





Fairytales: The Three Little Pigs – Week Five

The theme for our learning for this new half term is Fairy tales with a focus on the classic traditional tale The Three Little Pigs for the last week of term.

<p><u>Expressive Arts and Design</u></p> <p>Constructing houses for the three little pigs out of various materials, including straw, sticks and bricks. Make paper plate masks, these could then be used in the role play.</p> 	<p><u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u></p> <p>Think about the different themes in the books. How do you think the Mummy pig felt when her children left? How do you think the pigs felt? Were the three little pigs' kind at the end of the story? What would you have done?</p>	<p><u>Physical Development</u></p> <p>Safely explore tools such as screwing screws into planks of wood, nuts and bolts fitting together, hammers and golf tees. Play what's the time Mr Wolf. Use playdoh and materials such as matchsticks to create houses for the pigs.</p>
<p><u>Communication and Language</u></p> <p>Read different versions of The Three Little Pigs such as 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs', 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig' along with the original. Ask questions throughout. Use props to help re-tell the story, encourage children to help and allow them to independently re-enact the story too. Create a role play area/small world with the three little pigs, the wolf and their houses.</p>	<p><u>Literacy</u></p> <p>Sequencing the story. Writing simple sentences/CVCs. Explore mark making with sticks, mud, straw. Create wanted posters for the wolf. Make story maps. Create comic strips of the pigs and wolf with speech bubbles for the children to fill in with the repeated phrases. Label a picture from the story. Drawing Club: ROAD RUNNER</p>	<p><u>Understanding the World</u></p> <p>Look at different materials that the pigs could have used. Make houses using these materials and carry out experiments. Will they blow down? Are they waterproof?</p> 
<p><u>Mathematics</u></p> <p>Counting materials used to build the houses. Writing numbers on their doors. Looking at ordinal numbers, 1st, 2nd, 3rd.</p>	<p><u>Ideas to Explore at Home</u></p> <p>Share the story at home: The Three Little Pigs - Read aloud in fullscreen with music and sound effects!
