- Identify units of repeating patterns
- Create own pattern rules
- Explore own pattern rules

- Visualise from different positions

Physical Development

Gross motor skills: create a plank outside for children to balance on. Create bottle cap boatshave a race using spray bottles to move them. Play the game 'Captain says...scrub the deck, climb the rigging...'

Fine motor skills: use shells to create patterns in the playdoh. Make fishes for our underwater world.
